If you're waiting for me you're backing up! I apologize for being a day late and a report short. So without further delay...Lets get busy! After reviewing all my top secret information the best thing I can say right now is fishing is just kind of average everywhere. Which is fine, if you put in the time you'll do just fine. What I do find very interesting is we have reds showing up, ill get to that in a moment. In Homer, Halibut fishing is steadily building and as of this moment has a 211 pounder leading the derby. I see reports of kings being caught in Seldovia and Halibut Cove. King catching in the fishing lagoon is also reported as slow to fair. Deep Creek, Anchor, and Kasilof Rivers are open for another weekend with catching having been reported as fair. Water clarity in these rivers has been clearing up. We can only hope it keeps it up through the weekend. Fishing for kings in the Kasilof and Kenai Rivers looks fair, also reds are starting to show up in the Kasilof. Don't forget the Russian River opens Sunday night and reds have been spotted. Moving on to Anchorage catching in Ship Creek is reporting as slow. Don't forget the king derby is coming up the 8th through the 15th, and catching is getting better every tide! Eagle River is open for another weekend but expected to be slow. If your dipnetting for hooligan you need to know salt water is closed, fresh water is open. Taking a look in Valdez the halibut fishing is also steadily improving and the leader in the derby there is weighing in at 162 pounds. Reds are making their presence know as they have checked in at the Eyak and Coghill Rivers as well as Clear Creek. I have received a report from the interior stating all lakes between Fairbanks and Delta Junction are free of ice and the fishing is good. On the local scene, here in the valley, we have kings all over but just not hot and heavy anywhere. Again if you put in the time you will be rewarded. The best places for a hook up would be the Little Su, Alexander or the Deshka River. All reporting slow to fair fishing. I have also gotten a few reports of kings being caught at the Willow and a couple at Montana Creek, so they are making their way north. Hot lures of choice right now are chrome and anything quickfish, hot pink spin and glo's and secret egg cures. That's all I have right now, its real sporadic out there.
